

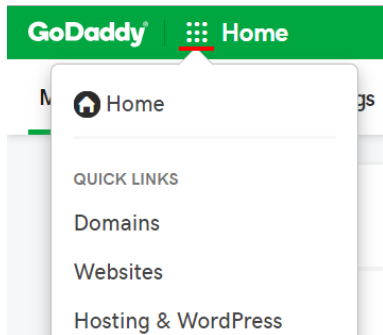
# GoDaddy File Manager

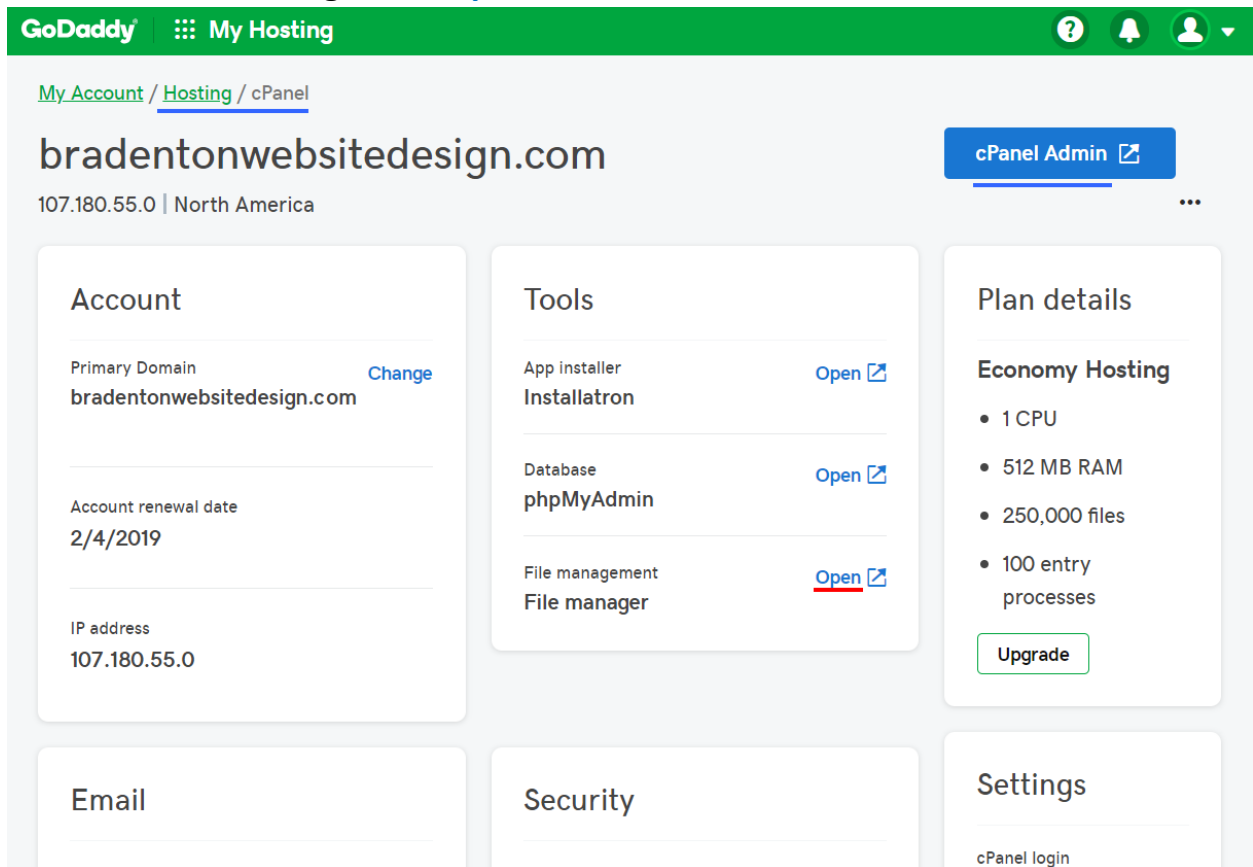
The [www.godaddy.com](http://www.godaddy.com) File Manager is just a temporary way to put one or two files online on your website. Later you will use an FTP client such as the free FileZilla (<https://filezilla-project.org/>), which will remember your username and password. Search YouTube for a FileZilla tutorial.

Log in to [www.GoDaddy.com](http://www.GoDaddy.com)

Click the square, 9-dot Links button, and then click **Hosting**.



Under cPanel **File manager**, click **Open** (Note cPanel Admin; use Settings to change your password.)



Click on **Blue Globe** to expand **public\_html**. That is where your site files are stored.

Click **Upload** to Browse to your newly created index.htm file and upload it to replace the home.htm placeholder file. The index.htm file has a higher priority than home.htm, so it will open by default.

Type your domain address in your browser's URL address bar and your new index file should open.

On the top Nav bar are additional options for **+Folder** (to create your images folder, **Rename, View**), **Up One Level** (to go to your images folder) ... *Do not use Edit or HTML Editor*. Edit on your local computer. That way, you can test before going live and you always have a local backup.
